

Book Review

Sue Roth has selected the following two books for our reading pleasure:

<u>The Aviator's Wife</u> by Melanie Benjamin is a historical fiction story about Charles and Anne Morrow Lindbergh .

For much of her life, Anne Morrow, the shy daughter of the U.S. ambassador to Mexico, has stood in the shadows of those around her, including her millionaire father and vibrant older sister, who often steals the spotlight. Then Anne, a college senior with hidden literary



aspirations, travels to Mexico City to spend Christmas with her family. There she meets Colonel Charles Lindbergh, fresh off his celebrated 1927 solo flight across the Atlantic. Enthralled by Charles's assurance and fame, Anne is certain the celebrated aviator has scarcely noticed her.

But she is wrong. You'll have to read the book to learn more.

The other book is narrative nonfiction, called **<u>Behind the Beautiful Forevers</u>**, by Pulitzer Prize winner Katherine Boo. With intelligence, humor, and deep insight into what connects human beings to one another in an era of tumultuous change, The reader is carried headlong into one of the twenty-first century's hidden worlds, and into the lives of people impossible to forget. It's a book about Annawadi, a makeshift settlement in Mumbai, India.

The 44th Annual Central Illinois World Affairs Conference will be held on March 8, 2014 at Embassy Suites Hotel Conference Center in East Peoria. Topic for this conference is : "Cybersecurity: Challenges and Opportunities in the Digital Age" with Opening Keynote address by Dr. Lori E. Murray, Distinguished Chair for the National Security at eh US Naval Academy, and Special Security Advisor to President Clinton. Bits and Pieces:

Challenges, appeals, and applause from Sen. Tom Harkin (D-IA) for the new draft rules on school food. Such rules suggested by First Lady Michelle Obama include banning advertisements for junk food.

And just when one thought her story couldn't get any more interesting, three letters were found that had been tucked away in an old folder of the AAUW archives, written by Nobel Prize-winning scientists <u>Niels Bohr</u>, <u>George de Hevesy</u>, and <u>James Franck</u>.
