**Chewy Caramel Bars** 

Bag of Kraft caramels

2/3 c. evaporated milk

1c. flour

3/4 c. oatmeal (Quick Quaker Oats) uncooked

1/2 c. brown sugar, packed

1/2 t. baking soda

1/4 t. salt

3/4 c. butter

1c. chocolate chips (milk or semi-sweet, or a combination)

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Melt caramels with milk in microwave or in heavy saucepan over low heat.

Combine dry ingredients. Cut in butter until mixture resembles course crumbs. Reserve a heaping 1/2 cup of this mixture.

Press remaining crumb mixture into bottom of greased 9 x 13 baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 minutes. Sprinkle chocolate pieces over baked crust. Pour caramel mixture evenly over chocolate pieces. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture. Continue baking 20-25 minutes. Chill 2 hours. Cut into bars. Makes 20-24 bars.
